PUBLIC SERVICE

Lloyd began her public service in 1983, serving a U.S. Congressman from her home state of New York. She had the honor of serving as special assistant to U.S. Senate Majority Leader Bob Dole (1988-1992), where she orchestrated the appointment of the first person with a disability to the U.S. Civil Rights Commission.

Lloyd also served as an appointee of two U.S. Presidents at the U.S. Departments of Agriculture (1985-1986) and Labor (2001-2006). She was Region IX Representative at the Labor Department and served as a liaison for congressional and intergovernmental affairs at both federal agencies.

From 2015-2020, Lloyd served as senior district representative for Senator Steve Glazer in the San Ramon Valley. From 2016-2018, she managed the San Ramon Valley's TRAFFIX Bus Program, serving four jurisdictions.

BUSINESS, ADVOCACY, NON-PROFIT & COMMUNITY SERVICE

Lloyd served as President & CEO of the Danville Area Chamber of Commerce from December 2020 – January 2025, where she revolutionized the way business, non-profits and community leaders connect. She grew the membership each year, reinvigorating its online communications through social media & videography, increasing engagement 200%. She founded the Women's Enterprise Initiative, an educational leadership training program in 2024, and created the Chamber's new digital magazine, authoring two editions. She served as vice chair of the California Chamber of Commerce Small Business Policy Council in 2024.

Lloyd owns <u>Altamont Strategies</u>, a small business in Contra Costa County, focused on communications, advocacy, public affairs & fundraising. She served as a Visiting Fellow at the Dole Institute of Politics, University of Kansas in 2015, running a 6-week video series on extraordinary women in politics & business.

Lloyd currently serves as a Board Member at <u>Three Valleys Community Foundation</u>, Vice President of the <u>Exchange Club of the San Ramon Valley</u>, and as a state leadership council member for the <u>National Federation of Independent Business</u>. She chaired the NFIB State PAC in 2022.

She is a member of the <u>Contra Costa Sheriff's Posse</u>, <u>Italian Catholic Federation</u>, <u>Museum of the San Ramon Valley</u>, and the <u>Danville Area Chamber of Commerce</u>. She served as a volunteer advocate for pancreatic cancer research in Washington, D.C., before the Speaker of the U.S. House and congressional leadership.

Lloyd was the first woman appointed by a U.S. President to serve as Region IX Representative for the U.S. Secretary of Labor, earning the Exceptional Achievement Award in 2004. She earned the *San Francisco Business Times* Women of Distinction Award in Politics & Government in 2003 and in 2020, she was inducted into the Contra Costa Women's Hall of Fame.
